their Saturday afternoon encounters.

The inaugural at East Orange proved that the team had possibilities. In the next matches the Blue and Gold defeated Linden, Regional, and North Plainfield on successive Saturdays. The team then went into a slump by tying Rahway and losing to Hillside and Roselle Park. In the Hillside game, the Blue and Gold nearly upset the powerful Comets. Leading 7-6 at half-time, the Cranford boys saw a possible victory drift away as the Hillside team pushed over four touchdowns in the second half to remain unbeaten. Roselle was soundly thrashed 40-0 for one of the highest scores in the county. The annual Jefferson Turkey Day battle was lost in the last fifty seconds as the Jeffmen tallied to win by 12-7.

The team enjoyed four victories, tasted defeat four times, and settled once for a tie. Scoring honors went to "Bus" Duffield, who rolled up 37 points.
