The Town Council has shown on several occasions that the individual members feel they are above the voters who went to the poils and cast their ballots to place the men in the Council seats.

Last Thursday night the feeling that the taxpayers don't count and that the Council members have been given the right by their election — not to represent the feeple, but to dictate laws and run the Town to suit their personal wishes—was made 100 per cent clear.

Meeting in a closed session, to which the public was not invited, the Council headed by Mayor Nuncio Pico and composed of Councilmen Ralph Guele, William Cullen, Robert Westpy and James Golden, decided what ordinances would be passed and which would be tabled and what would be defeated.

We believe the Councilman is sincere. From talks prior to his election we are aware that he is dedicated to the American From talks prior to his election we are aware that he is dedicated to the American form of government. We are disappointed that he has taken part in the closed sessions during the past two months. We feel certain that he will think twice before he insults his supporters again.

The taxpayers of our Town are tired of political deals made by political bosses. They want Councilmen who will work with the Town Manager to build a better Town, and ones who are aware that they are servants of the public not political bosses.

A word to the wise is supposedly sufficient. If the present Council members are wise men we feel certain that they will call an end to the secret, closed sessions.


