# Weapon charges lead to denial of liquor license

The Sayreville Borough Council has unanimously adopted a resolution denying Fred Leppig, owner of the Malibu Inn, a decades-old establishment on Ernston Road, the renewal of his liquor license due to crimes of moral turpitude.

The governing body decided not to renew the liquor license due to charges brought against him," Mayor Kennedy O'Brien

The council voted on the resolution at its public meeting Monday.

The resolution states that the Sayreville Police Department filed an objection to the renewal of the license, and upon request by the council, provided a number of reasons for the objection.

Leppig was reportedly involved in an altercation with a vending company representative around Oct. 2, 2000. The representative attempted to remove a soda machine because Leppig had failed to make his payments on the machine, according to the report. Leppig allegedly pulled a .45-caliber semi-automatic pistol on the representative and with his finger on the trigger, demanded that the representative leave the premises.

Leppig did not rebut the police department's testimony. However, at a hearing before the council, he did "deny that he pointed the gun in question at another (person)," according to

the resolution.

In December 2000, Leppig was indicted by a grand jury for possession of a weapon for unlawful purposes in the second degree and for aggravated assault in the fourth degree. Leppig pleaded guilty on April 30 to amended charges, which include one count of possession of an assault weapon in the third degree and two counts of terroristic threats in the third degree. He is currently awaiting sentencing on those charges and has agreed to rid himself of both the liquor license and the bar "as soon as reasonably possible,' according to the resolution.

# Committees set up to review tax

Old Bridge officials split into groups of 3 to meet on budget

ld Bridge Township Council President Dennis Maher, a Democrat, has established several council subcommittees to work with department heads to review the 2002 fiscal year municipal budget that was introduced by Republican Mayor Barbara Cannon, last week.

A schedule of meetings is being established to allow each committee, each comprised of three council members, to meet with each of the department heads, Republican Councilman Richard Greene said.

Council members received the budget late last week and said they are determined to look for ways to reduce the increase, although officials said it is too early to determine whether or not the mayor's proposed 6-cent tax rate increase can be reduced.

The mayor has done a great job in the past, and taxes have remained stable," Greene said. "However, during my last two years as a councilman, I feel my experience on the council will enable me to find a way to provide additional tax relief to the residents.'

Greene said he plans to review the expenditure and revenues portions of the budget to try to identi-

The last two years, the council estimated that more revenue

could be expected from court fines and building permits,' Greene said. "By increasing revenue projections, we decreased the amount of the tax increase. We proved that two years in a row we were right."

However, Township Finance Director Himanshu Shah said in a press conference last week that a shortfall of \$1.6 million in onetime revenues from last year and \$787,000 in emergency appropriations that were borrowed from this year's budget, were two of the main reasons for the 6-cent increase. The proposed 2002 budget of \$43,203,587 is \$2,249,746 higher than the fiscal year 2001 adopted budget.

This year, the township had in excess of \$500,000 in building permits from the Home Depot and Lowe's home centers, as well as the Globespan building, which is now under construction. However, the revenues collected by the township will not be available again next year, Cannon said.

After a quick perusal of the budget this weekend, Democratic Councilman Joseph Hoff said he plans to look into two areas in particular.

"I have a problem with the amount of money appropriated for land acquisition and parks development," Hoff said. "Although I'm a little upset about that, it is still too early to judge it. I may still change my mind.'

Old Bridge's municipal budget is based on a fiscal-year calendar that begins and ends in July. The council has until September to adopt the budget, after which time it will be forwarded to the state. Last year, a final budget was not adopted until December.

# Flags fly again after they're mysteriously returned

Letter in newspaper, sign appear to be responsible for flags' reappearance

lag thieves apparently had a change of heart last weekend as two American flags that were recently stolen from two separate homes in Sayreville and Old Bridge turned up at their owners' homes.

Both flags were returned to their owners safe and sound — one mysteriously reappeared in the neighborhood; the other was placed inside its owner's mailbox.

One of the flag owners, Christa Leslie, of Sayreville, wrote a letter to the editor, which was printed in last week's *Suburban*, stating that her brand new American flag was stolen from the front of her home sometime between July 7 and 8. In her letter, Leslie stated: "To the person or persons who stole my flag, I hope that you have put it to good use and that someday you learn to respect this symbol and what it stands for. Until then, I hope you feel just a little bit guilty and ashamed."

To Leslie's surprise, the flag was re-

turned to her home by a neighbor.

"A person who lives around the corner from me said that he found the flag draped over a parked car near his home that weekend," Leslie said. "He took it home, dried it out and tried to locate its owner."

After he read Leslie's letter to the editor, he returned the flag, according to Leslie, and it is now flying on the flagpole in front of her home.

After reading Leslie's letter, Old Bridge resident Michele Sulikowski decided to contact the Suburban to report that her flag had also been stolen. Sulikowski discovered that her flag — a sentimental memento given to her family by the Veterans Administration when her father passed away at the age of 74 in 1999 — had been stolen from a flagpole in front of her home sometime between July 13 and 14. Her father, Gerard Gallucci, had served in the U.S. Navy during World War II.

"This flag draped my father's coffin in December of 1999," Sulikowski said. "Since my father was such a supporter of this great country and flew a flag all his life, my mom thought it would be a nice tribute to him to continue to do so with this flag."

Last year, Sulikowski had a flagpole

installed on her property on Route 516, and on April 15 of last year, her family gathered to raise the flag on what would have been the 50th wedding anniversary of her parents, Gerard and Marie Gallucci of Toms River.

"My whole family gathered, and we raised this flag with many tears for the first time," Sulikowski said. "Since that date, I continued to fly this flag on special occasions. One would be for my dad's birthday in June and again on July Fourth."

Sulikowski said her mother was devastated after finding out her husband's flag had been stolen.

"When we looked at it, it represented our dad. You can't replace that with a flag bought in a store," she said.

Searching for a way to urge the person or persons who stole the flag to return it, Sulikowski placed a sign on the front lawn of her home, which read "The stolen flag draped my father G. Gallucci's coffin. Please return the flag!"

"The person who stole the flag doesn't know our story. We just wanted it back with no questions asked," she said.

Sulikowski's prayers were answered on Saturday afternoon — the same day

Leslie's flag was returned — when the flag was returned safely to her home. Sulikowski said that her husband found the flag in the mailbox when he went to retrieve the mail. The flag was placed in the mailbox and folded the correct way by an anonymous person.

"You could have knocked me over with a feather when I saw my husband walking up the driveway with the flag in his hands," she said.

Sulikowski spent the next several hours calling her mother and her five brothers and sisters to let them know the flag was returned.

"My mom cried when I told her, and everyone else was in a state of disbelief," Sulikowski said. "It was a bittersweet moment; it opened up everything for all of us. My dad was close to us. I miss him every day of my life."

The flag is flying proudly once again, and Sulikowski said she intends to fly the flag every day until the end of the month. Only this time, the flag will be taken down every night at dusk.

A new sign at the Sulikowski's house now reads: "Thank you for returning my father's flag!"

# Community center will be on ballot in November election

SAYREVILLE — In a unanimous vote during Monday's public meeting, the Borough Council adopted an ordinance to hold a referendum that will ask voters to authorize building a community center.

The referendum will be voted on during the Nov. 6 general election.

A borough resident questioned the council at the meeting on the need to construct a community center in

Sayreville, saying that perhaps officials should consider expanding the existing senior center on Main Street instead.

Mayor Kennedy O'Brien responded saying that the proposed community center has been an idea the recreation board has been working on for some time. It would allow for activities for people of all ages, he said.

O'Brien also said the center would include several basketball courts and other athletic areas the senior center has no room for.

Previously, Councilman John Melillo said the center would include a community-swimming pool, a skate park, a workout area and basketball courts. He also said he hopes the facility could include a place for dancing, where entertainment could be provided for a different age group each night.

Although the council is already in the design stages of the project, the location of the community center has not yet been determined. Melillo said he wants it to be centrally located and easily accessible to

all borough residents.

Melillo stressed that the project must be planned well, so that it takes potential population growth in the borough into account, and not become outdated in years to come.

Before the council can move too far ahead on construction plans, however, the residents will have make the decision Nov. 6.

"The time is right for something like this in Sayreville," Melillo said. "We're looking for town support."

# Officials push for farmland preservation involvement

Middlesex County has 21 farms for 3,158 acres in the state program

OLD BRIDGE — Now that Old Bridge has its first landowner applying for the state Farmland Preservation Program, township officials are hoping more local farmers will follow suit in an effort to help preserve more open space in the community

At Monday night's council meeting, the Township Council supported a resolution for the application of Ann Miller, who has applied to the state program in an effort to preserve her property of 12.5 acres on Cottrell Road.

Miller, 77, said she hopes other landowners in the township follow her lead and apply for the program.

"I mentioned it to my neighbor, who owns 12 acres next to my property," Miller said. "I hope it is something he considers doing in the future."

The state program received a boost in funding in 1999 after former Gov. Christie Whitman set a goal to preserve 500,000 acres of farmland in New Jersey. In an effort to meet her goal, the Garden State Preservation Trust Act produced nearly four times the amount of available funding for the program than it had in the past.

Since the inception of the Farmland Preservation Program in 1983, some 584

farms have been successfully preserved for agricultural or open space purposes in New Jersey, for a total of 80,611 acres, according to the National Agriculture Statistics report. As of 1998, the most recent year that statistics are available, there were approximately 830,000 acres of farmland in the state.

In Middlesex County, 21 farms have been preserved since 1983, for a total of 3,158 acres, according to Hope Gruzlovic, spokesperson for the state program.

After an extensive review of the township's land area of 39.1 square miles last year by the township's planning office, it was determined that 42 percent of the municipality consists of vacant land and farms.

The study prompted the township and its agencies to support the state program and become an active participant in the program in an effort to stop runaway building in the community and preserve as much open space as possible.

The program enables landowners to sell the development rights on their farmland to the county. When landowners sell their development rights, also known as development easements, they retain ownership of their land but agree to permanent deed restrictions that allow the land to be used for agricultural uses only.

According to Linda Busch, principal planner at the Middlesex County Agricultural Development Board (CADB), the program is a joint effort that

is funded by the state, counties and municipalities, with each entity being responsible for paying a percentage of the costs associated with preserving property.

"After a value has been set for an easement purchase, the state will pay for 60 percent of that amount, Middlesex County will pay for 20 percent of that amount, and the remaining 20 percent is paid for by the municipality," said Busch. She added that funding at the local level can vary.

After an application is received by the county from a landowner, it takes more than a year to complete the entire process, Busch said.

"From April through June, we received 12 applications," Busch said. "Each farm was granted preliminary approval last Wednesday by the CADB after it reviewed each application." This fall, Busch said, the application for each farm will be forwarded to the state's Agriculture Development Committee (SADC).

In order to be eligible for the program, farms must be located in an agricultural development area. The SADC prioritizes applications for preservation funding through a ranking system that assigns points for the following: the percentage of high-quality soils; the percentage of tillable acres; suitable boundaries and buffers.

such as other nearby preserved farms and open space; the local commitment to agriculture, such as right to farm ordinances and financial commitment; size of the farm and agricultural density of the area; and imminence of development. These quality scores establish the SADC's preliminary priority list for preservation.

priority list for preservation.

The SADC certifies development values for each farm based on independent appraisals conducted by two licensed appraisers and a review by an SADC staff appraiser. Counties hire appraisers from an SADC-approved list.

Once the SADC certifies development easement values through the appraisers, landowners have 30 days to submit their offers. A landowner can improve a farm's ranking on the preliminary priority list by offering to discount, or sell the development easement for less than the certified value. For every 1 percent a landowner discounts, two points are added to the farm's quality score. Landowner offers establish the final priority list for preservation. The number of farms that will be preserved each round depends on available state and county, and sometimes, municipal funding.



OLD BRIDGE — Township resident Diane Hittner, who is the Libertarian Party candidate for the state Assembly, 13th district, defeated a Republican Party challenge to her nominating petition on July 11.

Out of the 67 signatures on Hittner's petition for nomination, 12 were deemed invalid

by two administrative law judges representing Monmouth and Middlesex counties, leaving her with 55 signatures. Election laws require that prospective candidates have 50 valid signa-

Five of the remaining 55 signatures on Hittner's petition were also disputed, but unless the GOP challenges those five signatures, Hittner has secured a place on the

ballot for the November general election.
"I'm pleased that the 13th District voters will have a real alternative in November,' said Hittner, who is 26 and the mother of a 4vear-old son. "Everyone who feels overtaxed and overregulated will have the opportunity to send a message to the politicians and political parties, which have been taking them for granted,'

In November, Hittner will be running against Republican Assemblymen Joseph Azzolina and Sam Thompson. The Democratic ticket includes challengers Steven T. Piech of West Keansburg and Kevin Graham of Keyport.

Because the 13th District covers both Old Bridge and Spotswood in Middlesex County and eight northern Monmouth County municipalities, the hearing on her petition was held in both Freehold and New Brunswick.

Hittner said she received a phone call from the state Division of Elections on July 2 stating that the Republican State Committee had challenged her petition because, they claimed, she had insufficient signatures.

The GOP challenged 39 of the signatures, according to Hittner, claiming that 30 were invalid because either they had multiple mailing addresses or they could not be located. Nine signatures, the party claimed, were invalid because of sloppy handwriting.

Six of the names on the petition were questioned because they were not technically accurate, according to Hittner.

One name was brought into question because the name was signed as Bob when the person's actual name was Robert," she

Hittner said the GOP challenge did not slow her down in her pursuit for a campaign bid. She greeted voters at a home-schoolers convention on June 30 at Brookdale Community College, Monmouth County, and on July 13 she participated in a protest in Red Bank against Monmouth County's

firearms exchange program.

"I don't believe in using taxpayers' money to pay people to bring in firearms," Hittner said. "We're getting

firearms out of the hands of our next-door neighbors, not criminals. We should not take guns out of the hands of law-abiding citi-

Hittner said her next step is to set up her own Web site.

Part of her agenda, she said, includes restoring rights to individuals and parents.

"I don't believe in mandatory vaccines for children," Hittner said. "Parents should not be bullied by doctors and schools to vaccinate their children if they do not wish to."


elected to office, Hittner said her first goal would be to repeal the mandatory hepatitis B vaccine.

"Children are not an at-risk group for contracting hepatitis B," she said.

Another issue involving children that Hittner is concerned about is what she calls the over-diagnoses of children with attention deficit disorder (ADD) and the overprescription of Ritalin.

"Too many teachers and school officials are diagnosing children with ADD and recommending that they be put on Ritalin, and they are not even qualified to make such a diagnosis," she said.

Hittner said she plans to stand by her party's platform, which encourages personal and economic freedom to all individuals.

# Café Lavareda raided by undercover police

SOUTH RIVER — Café Lavareda was raided by police July 13 after undercover police officers allegedly witnessed the illegal sale of alcohol and the use of gambling

According to police Detective John Casey, the café is a coffee shop and sold alcohol over the counter without the proper licenses. The café also maintained slot machines for gambling. The machines were surrounded by walls that hid them from the remainder of the premises.

The owner, Antonio Santos, 40, and his wife, Augusta, 41, both South River residents, were arrested that night.

The manager, Alberto Salgado, 54, a resident of Elizabeth, was also arrested.

All three were charged with maintaining a gambling resort, maintaining a nuisance, possession of gambling devices, failure to obtain the licenses necessary to

sell alcohol, selling alcohol illegally and various other local ordinance violations.

Bail was set at \$5,000 each, according to Casey, and they all posted bail that

Café Lavareda has been under investigation by the South River police and the Middlesex County Prosecutor's Narcotics Task Force for about two months. According to police, after receiving complaints from patrons of the café, undercover police went to the premises and were sold alcohol illegally. The undercover officers also played the slot machines in a small, hidden room that could fit only four people, Casey said.

During the raid, police confiscated the alcohol, recovered two video slot machines and seized \$2,800 in cash,

according to Casey.

Eight other people were arrested for violating a local ordinance by illegally consuming alcohol.

# School district commended for programs, efficiency

Old Bridge compared to four other districts in area in state study

OLD BRIDGE — The township's school district has received high marks from a state agency that provides consulting and management reviews to local governments at no cost.

The Local Government Budget Review (LGBR) program was created in New Jersey in 1994 by former Gov. Christie Whitman. The inception of the program marked the first time the state began working closely with towns to examine the cause and effect of rising costs on local governments. The mission of the program is to "help local governments and school boards find savings and efficiencies without compromising the delivery of services to the public," according to an LGBR spokesperson.

In order to conduct a comprehensive management review, the review team worked closely with both the educational community and the community at large.

"We are very pleased with the report and are proud that it validates our status as an efficiently run school district," said Daniel M. Rodriguez, superintendent of schools.

While comparing the general administrative salaries with central office salaries in four other districts, the study team discovered that Old Bridge was lowest in per pupil costs, and lower than the state and Middlesex County medians, according to the report. The comparison districts used in the study were Woodbridge, Piscataway, Edison and Middletown.

For administrators' salaries, Old Bridge falls in the middle of the comparison districts. However, it is lower than the New Jersey and Middlesex County averages, according to the report.

The LGBR commended the Old Bridge school district for actively pursuing several technology grants. It also cited the district for making a concentrated effort to provide technical training to its staff. That includes the training of several staff members who provide training for additional staff members during in-service days.

The district was also commended for providing training through the Middlesex County Educational Technology Training Center, located in the East Brunswick school district.

The LGBR recognized the district for instituting new measures affecting cost and service delivery.

For example, the district is using a live television broadcast to present information to the staff about the affirmative action program. The district is also part of the Cooperative Satellite Learning Project, through which Allied Signals Technical Services Corp. and the National Aeronautics and Space Administration work with nine schools nationwide encouraging students to pursue careers in science, engineering, mathematics and the space industry.

The district has also worked on communications initiatives which will enable it to trade information with all parts of the community.

Programs at the district's two middle schools help to motivate students to participate in after-school activities, the report stated.

Special programs involving use of planetariums are available to middle school students as well as elementary students, who are transported to the schools to participate.

To help create a positive school environment, a peer leadership program was instituted by the school and includes training activities in conflict resolution and peer mediation.

The LGBR also stated that the district has a "sound approach" when it comes to its hiring policies. It specifically cited policies that limited granting experience credit to new instruction staff for a maximum of three years, with exceptions for teaching areas where applicant shortages might exist. That approach, the LGBR stated, is "one that attempts to avoid excessive salary costs while permitting flexibility in difficult employment areas."

# Officials: Shared services are a way of saving money

Board member wants voters to consider that in voting on referendum

SAYREVILLE — The Board of Education and the Borough Council are working together in order to save taxpayers money.

At last week's school board meeting, the board approved a request to share its truck to help the borough pick up residents' "white goods" for disposal, in exchange for the borough's sweeping out the schools' parking lots regularly, according to Board of Education member Arthur Rittenhouse.

Refrigerators, washing machines and dryers are examples of white goods, which officials said are too large for the trucks the borough is currently using.

Interlocal agreements, such as this one, help cut down on costs to the borough. In this case, the borough doesn't have to pay for a new truck and the board doesn't have to pay for a sweeping service.

These agreements often fall under a state tax-credit program called the Regional Efficiency Aid Program (REAP). Through REAP, the borough receives credit for trying to reduce costs by implementing regionalization, Rittenhouse said.

Another example of an interlocal agreement in the borough is in the bidding for maintenance services used for the borough's and school districts' lawns. One company bids for the maintenance of all the grounds, and this shared bid saves money for both the borough and the school board.

According to Wayne Kronowski, the borough's business administrator, the bor-

W,

ough has received a tax credit of \$152,923 — which averages to \$12.78 in savings to the average homeowner. This amount was based on money that was saved last year, Kronowski said.

Rittenhouse said he believes many residents are unaware of the school board's role in the interlocal agreements. Many of the programs are initiated by the board, Rittenhouse said, however, since all the money goes back to the borough, the municipality is the only agency that receives credit for helping residents save money on their taxes.

"We're looking for more publicity from

the borough," he said. Rittenhouse said school officials are hoping residents will realize the board, as well as the council, has saved them money, and that they will take that into account when voting on the December referendum, which will ask voters to approve the construction of an upper-elementary school. The new school, officials said, would help alleviate overcrowding in the elementary and middle schools by moving the fifth and sixth grades to the new school. The cost of the new school is presently unknown, but a state grant may cover about 40 percent of the cost, according to school officials.

At Monday's council meeting, a borough resident raised concern that the date of the school referendum comes after a borough referendum asking voters to approve a community center. The borough's referendum, scheduled to take place during the November general election, asks voters to approve a \$15-million community center.

The resident told the council he believes voters will not want to approve that much spending, and said he feels that having a new school should be the top priority.

# Sides debate bill's purpose

LAKEWOOD — State Sen. Robert Singer (R-30) has introduced a bill that would prohibit zoning changes from being made on properties for which applications have already been deemed complete.

Singer, who is a member of the Lakewood Township Committee, said his purpose in developing the legislation was to protect an individual who submits an application to a planning board only to have a municipal government change the zoning on the property that renders his planned use illegal.

He said the bill was developed to protect "the little guy, not developers."

"This bill will protect the person who bought a piece of land in a commercial zone who maybe wants to put up a gas station, but when he goes to obtain the necessary approvals he finds out the zoning is going to be changed, and he can no longer operate a business there now," Singer said.

According to the language of the bill Singer proposes, the bill would modify the "time of decision" rule which currently allows municipal officials to change zoning regulations during the time an application for development is pending.

"Local officials should be able to zone any way they want to," he said. "What they shouldn't be able to do is change zoning because they decide they don't like a certain application."

Singer said the bill does not seek to undermine municipal sovereignty and said local officials would still be able to set their own zoning standards according to their approved master plans.

The bill has been approved in the state

Assembly (46-17, with two abstentions and 15 members not voting) and now awaits state Senate approval, according to John Moran, a legislative analyst with the New Jersey League of Municipalities.

In recent weeks one local official has

publicly stated his opposition to Singer's proposal. Jackson Mayor Joseph Grisanti called the proposal "pro-developer" and said he fears it will have a detrimental effect on towns by taking away some zoning and planning abilities.

"This bill undermines all our efforts and everything we're trying to do here" in terms of controlling development, Grisanti said. "I can't understand why Sen. Singer would sponsor a bill like this. It's definitely a pro-developer bill, and it will affect Jackson in a very negative way."

A letter from the New Jersey State League of Municipalities to mayors states that this legislation "would make a drastic change by providing that protection for a developer from the time that the application is deemed complete ... and which is before any public hearing or decision on the merits of the application. That immunity would exist even where a community was in the process of its master plan review, and was considering zoning changes as part of that review. It would exist when a governing body realized it needed to close a loophole or correct and error. It would exist at the expense of the public interest."

League of Municipalities administrators are encouraging municipal officials to contact the members of the Senate Community Affairs Committee to express their concerns with the bill.



# **Active pursuit of farmland** preservation is warranted

t is with mixed feelings that we find out an application for state farmland preservation on a 12.5-acre Old Bridge property is the first such submission from that township.

Like much of Middlesex County, the township has been using a variety of means to acquire open space, including collecting an open space tax for the purchase of vacant land. But it's a shame that a town as large as Old Bridge has had no involvement in the state's Farmland Preservation Program to this point.

To date, only 21 farms in the county have been preserved, for a total of 3,158 acres. But the rest of the state has managed to preserve 563 farms for some 77,453 acres, since the farmland preservation program was introduced.

It's true that much of Middlesex County was already developed by the time the program took flight during the 1980s, but it would be nice to have seen more farmers from our neck of the woods jump on the bandwag-

Farmers can't be blamed for this — their compensation for entering the farmland preservation program is far less than that which they can get from a developer eyeing their farm for perhaps tens of millions of dollars in houses. By entering the program,

farmers get only what an independent appraiser says their land is worth. If their farm is accepted, the state, county and municipality pay the farmer in turn for a guarantee that the land will never be used for anything other than agricultural purposes.

If open space is what a community seeks, then this program is indeed something that should be pursued. While the town and county will have to pitch in for a portion of the cost to buy the farm's development rights, the state picks up between 60 and 80 percent of the tab.

Local officials should not sit back and wait for farms to suddenly join the program. It's up to them to advocate for such anendeavor, especially those many officials who were elected on platforms that included open space preservation.

Municipal officials can follow the examples of those towns leading the way in achieving farmland preservation by forming committees to take inventory of the remaining farms in their communities and decide which properties are best to pursue - perhaps the largest properties or those in rural areas that are best left free from development. They can then notify those landowners about the program and encourage submis-

# Tools exist to ease suburban sprawl

s we head toward the November elections, suburban sprawl has already staked a claim as a front-burner issue. Homeowners worry about it. Elected officials, from the municipal level all the way up to the Statehouse, debate how to stop it. Farmers have mixed feelings about it, wondering whether we can control sprawl without drastically reducing land values and the rights of private property

Solutions for stopping suburban sprawl are complex. One perfect plan to stop sprawl-type overdevelopment of New Jersey's rural and suburban communities does not exist. However, there are tools at our disposal to help direct the growth into appropriate areas while respecting the rights of those who own the land.

For example, the state Planning Commission readopted New Jersey State **Guest Column**

Development and Redevelopment Plan (SDRP) earlier this year. This document contains many references to planning and zoning tools. The plan supports the viability of the farming industry as well as preserving open space for both recreation and agriculture.

Additionally, New Jersey already has one of the most aggressive land preservation programs in the nation. Both the Farmland Preservation and Green Acres programs aim to preserve a combined 1 million acres of New Jersey's open space and farmland by the year 2010. With each acquisition (whether it's an outright purchase of the land or simply the purchase of development rights), we come one step closer to reaching our goal and protect one more precious piece of open space from development.

Working together to find creative solutions that work for each community is the great task before us. But before gubernatorial candidates and those running for the Legislature rush headlong to seek a magic formula, they need to know that there is no "one-size-fits-all" approach that will work from High Point to Cape May.

They also must understand that tools exist to curb sprawl, preserve New Jersey's farmland and protect the rights of those who own open space — goals each of us should strive for.

With vision and a sense of fair play, we can make those tools work in each of New Jersey's unique communities.

# Sayreville youth succeeds in nat'l competition



# **Barber remembers** a different Matawan

At 84, Ted Daloia has no intention of turning in his shears

MATAWAN — Ted Daloia remembers a different Matawan.

Daloia, who has spent nearly the past 50 years cutting hair and swapping stories with his customers in Teddy's Barber Shop, 54 Main St., has called Matawan home since he was born 84 years ago.

"I grew up in Matawan, and I learned the

business in Matawan," said Daloia.

Daloia has fond recollections of how he got his start working in a barbershop on Main Street at about 13 years old.

"My grandmother dragged me down there by the ear and said, 'Give him a job

because I don't want him hanging out on the street," recalled Daloia.

"I tried to quit a couple of times, but she always chased me back," he added.

Eventually Daloia grew to like the business and decided to train as a barber, spending some time in a Keyport shop

when some of the regulars in the shop where he had apprenticed on Main Street thought he was too young to cut their hair.

The training he received and the traditions he learned working around the Bayshore as a young apprentice shape the way Daloia does things even today.

"I learned to give halfway decent haircuts, and that is what I still give today," said Daloia, noting that he does not go in for any of the "fancy stuff" or longer hair styles

popular with younger generations. Nephew Jim Daloia, of Shamong Township in Burlington County, recalled how in his day, going to Matawan High School in the age of long hair in the 1960s, if you went for a haircut at Teddy's, you would be in for it in school the next day.

"You knew that if you went to Teddy's, you were getting a short haircut, something really traditional," said the nephew.

According to Daloia, that period of time is when he started to see a real difference from his days as a young man.

"In my time, if you had a date with a girl, you went to the barber and got your hair cut and combed with tonic so you would look

Daloia noted that during the good old days, his shop, which is set to officially turn 50 this September, was a gathering place for the men of the community.

"Years ago they would come in here; before and after they got a haircut they would hang around and tell jokes and talk sports," Ted recalled, noting that type of customer was a rarity today.

"It was part of the experience, and people loved to wait here, but today people don't want to wait," he said. "Guys used to take about horse racing, sports, politics, you

name it. Today all they talk about is taxes.

Back in the days when the shop was a gathering place, Daloia used to set up a bar with whiskey and soda for his customers' enjoyment during the holi-

days. "These days you would probably get arrested for something like that," he said. "It was just a different world then. Matawan was a small community where everyone know everybody else's name."


Despite the changes in the community and the changes in how men wear their hair, Teddy's Barber Shop has its fair share of regulars who are loyal to the traditional haircuts they get week after week.

# The history of a ship's namesake, home port

he's a grand old ship. Her mission is her name. She's the USS Supply, the Navy's largest combat logistics ship. She was decommissioned at 10 a.m. July 13. Still, she's doing as she's always done, just with a different crew.

Remaining at Naval Weapons Station Earle, Leonardo section of Middletown, the USS Supply will continue to supply the fleet. "It'll be what's referred to as a hot transfer," said Earle Public Information Officer Nancy Eldridge. "It's business as usual for the ship. It keeps going but just changes command' with the ship's captain Robert S. Warner at the helm of the ceremony.

What it all means is that after July 13, the USS Supply's mission is accomplished under the umbrella of the Military Sealift Command, still an arm of the U.S.

Department of Defense.

From now on, the ship will be called the USNS Supply (United States Naval Ship Supply). While there will be a small military detachment aboard the vessel, the switch to Military Sealift Command management means that the bulk of the crew will comprise civilians now.

This may be the second in a series of changes setting sail at Earle Naval Weapons Station, but Navy officials promise the mission of the historic port won't change and neither will that of the ship. Though the Supply name has seen quite a history of diverse distinction. This USS Supply is the fourth ship to bear the name.

According Eldridge, the first Supply supported Commodore Perry's forces during the Mexican American War and the Union's operations in the Civil War.


The second Supply was in the Spanish American War and after being recommissioned, fired the first shot by U.S. forces in World War I. During World War II, a third Supply served as an aviation support ship.

Last, the Supply was commissioned in San Diego, Calif, in 1994 and brought to its then home port in Norfolk, Va., where, ironically, the USS Seattle was just sent

last month. In 1996, the Supply was first deployed to the Mediterranean Sea and the Persian Gulf. Her home port was then changed to Earle, the port from which she made other deployments in 1998 and 2000 and supported battle groups, Eldridge added.

A 753-foot, 48,500-long-ton fast combat support ship, the current USS Supply is specially constructed to keep pace with carrier battle groups. The ship is also equipped with all the essential armament. In order to expeditiously carry out its mission of replenishing Navy task forces with a capacity to carry more than 250 tons of refrigerated stores, 500 tons of dry stores,

2,150 tons of ammunition and 177,000 barrels of oil.

In port, the USS Supply's appearance is majestically overwhelming. In carrying out her mission, she "gets petroleum products, ammunition and stores from shuttle ships and redistributes these items simultaneously to carrier battle group ships," Eldridge added.

There are two methods of replenishment employed to get the supplies from ship to ship vertical and connected. As Eldridge explained, "Two helicopters assigned to the ship transfer loads to customer ships while connected replenishment systems spanning to two ships allow for transfer of fuel and pallets between them."

But more consistent than the name of a ship is the mission of Earle. It all started in 1943 when the need for an ammunition depot near New York City became prevalent to support World War II efforts.

It was soon determined by a

It was soon determined by a Department of Defense panel that the present Earle site was best because of its location. The present pier in Leonardo was deemed safest and "operationally advantageous," as ready access to the commercial rail and lines that navigated from the west where most ammunition shipments came from, according to a historical account. The site was also far enough from the gen-

eral population to not create any safety hazard.

Originally dubbed Naval Ammunition Depot Earle, upon its construction in August 1943, the facility was named after Rear Admiral Ralph Earle, who was the chief of the Bureau of Ordnance in World War I

A military road and railway were built connecting the complex in Colts Neck to the waterfront and pier, which is a total of 2.9 miles long, 2.2 miles of which extend into Sandy Hook Bay. The ammunition depot pier was ready for use in December 1943.

In 1974 the official name of Earle was changed from Naval Ammunition Depot to Naval Weapons Station Earle. The name change was to be a reflection of the Navy's evolving needs in the post-WW II era.

Earle is still connected from its 10,000acre main-side facility in Colts Neck to its waterfront station in Leonardo by a 15mile military road and rail line called Normandy Road. Colts Neck houses the bulk of Earle's departments and facilities, including military housing.

including military housing.

The pier in Leonardo "provides ammunition for nearly every class of ship operated by the U.S. Navy and Coast Guard as well as commercial vessels from other countries," according to the literature.

n any given Sunday (or in this case Thursday), anything can happen. Just when you think you have a victory locked up and are poised to put the game away with one last offensive strike, disaster can strike and change the outcome of the game.

With 10 seconds left, Union's Steve

Andriola kicked the extra point to complete the unlikely comeback.

It was a play that had players and coaches on both sides of the field shaking their heads, after what had been a hardfought contest, though one without too many spectacular plays.

Middlesex got itself out to a 10-3 halftime lead on a 28-yard field goal from former Edison star Mike Tambini and a fiveyard scoring scamper from Piscataway's Mike Pernell.

But Union stormed back to tie the game in the third quarter. That set up another Middlesex drive, which was capped by a 32-yard touchdown pass from Tambini to Jon Herres with 10:55 remaining in the game.

The Middlesex defense then did its job, stopping the Union offense cold on its next possession.



In Consolation Round D, North Brunswick emerged victorious, knocking off Bayshore (22-13) and Bound Brook


