For more than a decade the Save Our Bridge group and now Save Our Bay, Inc. have stressed the importance of preserving Sanibel's way of life through restoring the Sanibel drawbridge rather than replacing it with a high-span bridge.

However, recent efforts to rehabilitate the drawbridge has also sparked the interest on Sanibel's future

generations.

Nine-year-old Nicole Horton, a student at the Sanibel School is possibly one of the youngest members of Save Our Bay. Despite her youth, Nicole shares the same ideals and hopes for the island's future as many of the adults in the organization.

"I've had a good life on Sanibel island... if we build a high-span bridge it will change all of that," Nicole said in a speech she made to Save Our Bay, Inc. at its wine and cheese social held Thursday at the Bailey Matthews Shell Museum.

When you drive over the drawbridge, Nicole said, you see the beauty of Sanibel, but the fixed span bridge would change that. Nicole also pointed out that

Traffic still tops residents' concerns

Throughout the coming year, the City of Sanibel will face a number of issues while evaluating its plan for the future of the city.

Perhaps one of the more complicated issues facing the city is the relationship among the residential, resort and retail functions of the island.

At the first public session regarding the city's upcoming Evaluation and Appraisal Report, the Planning Commission heard input from numerous residents regarding traffic, tourism and their relationship to the residents of the island.

Although the economic assumptions of the Sanibel Plan link the island's economic success to the viability of its natural systems, these issues also play an important role in the island's economic future.

When the city conducted its last evaluation of the Sanibel Plan seven years ago, island traffic was one of the major issues addressed in the report. This evaluation is no different.

In the last month, the Sanibel City Council has evaluated possible solutions to the island's traffic problem including a proposed roundabout to replace the fourway-stop at Periwinkle Way and Causeway Boulevard.

However, some residents thought alternate methods of transit to the island may be the solution to the gridlock. Ferries, trollies and mass transit systems were just some of the suggestions for solving Sanibel's traf-

Sanibel resident, Eric Jorgenson, suggested the city

purchase land off-island where visitors could park their vehicles and ride a trolly or tram over to the island,

With the growth in Florida and the growth on this coast, there is not much of this left and a lot of people want to see it," Jorgenson said. "I think we should provide alternative methods for people to visit the island."

Sanibel has a growing demand for people outside the island to visit, according to John Adler with Real Estate Analytical Services.

That gridlock is not going to go away," Adler said. "It's an issue that solely threatens the quality of life on this island more than any other issue and needs to be addressed.

While some residents looked for solutions to the island's traffic problems, others felt the city should leave the problem alone.

The traffic problem should not be solved," said Sanibel resident Henry Glissman. "It will limit itself. If you improve things, you will get more people."

Resident Barbara Cooley echoed his comments, stating that the way to deal with it is not to deal with it, and not accommodate the excess of cars coming to the island

Cooley also said it's important for the business community to understand the residential community.

"I think business on Sanibel needs to learn about the residents on the island," Cooley said. "You need to listen to the people who live here and get some things out in the open."

the drawbridge detracts criminals.

The new bridge would also bring more traffic to the island and the exhaust from the cars would damage the ecosystem, Nicole said in her speech.

'Someday when I am grown up and I have children, I want them to be able to enjoy the wildlife and the beauty of Sanibel like I have.

Save Our Bay President, Marie Gargano, commended Nicole for her efforts.

"I thought, who more appropriate to have as a guest speaker than someone who represents the next generation," Gargano said. "It's great that we will live out our generation here, but it really is for future generations that we are trying to protect Sanibel."

Prior to the speech, Save Our Bay, Inc. played host to a wine and cheese party while providing informa-

tional material to its guests regarding its position on replacement versus rehabilitation of the drawbridge.

Two major highlights of the presentation were the financial analysis regarding the costs of rehabilitation and replacement and the rehabilitation plan prepared by Save Our Bay, Inc. consul-


The financial plan calculates the amount of money saved by rehabilitating only span a of the Causeway.

Lee County could save an estimated \$17 million in construction costs by rehabilitating the drawbridge, according to the report prepared by SOB Financial Consultant Cliff Fitzgerald, Jr., who holds an MBA from Harvard. The savings in interest and principal over the 30-year bond life amounts to \$39 million. If some of the savings were used to pay the operating and maintenance costs over the 30-year period, the total savings would total \$32 million, Fitzgerald said in his report. Save Our Bay attorney Ralf Brookes commended the groups expert consultants stating that

their time and effort has been invalu-

Save Our Bay's lawsuit against Lee County claims that the county collected an excess of toll monies from those using the Sanibel Causeway. Through the suit, the group hopes rehabilitate the drawbridge and refund collected toll money to those who use the Causeway. Save Our Bay will go to court in May.



Commissioner Marie Gargano said the visitors to the island are "loving Sanibel to death.'

We're being loved by people who want to drive around the island all day and then leave," Gargano said. "I don't know what they contribute to the environment, but I know they contribute to the degradation of Sanibel's environ-



Another issue addressed by the public dealt with resort housing and retail business on the island.

The island is in a great state of change, according to Adler. Sanibel's tax base is constantly growing due to the amount of wealth migrating to the islands, he said. However, Adler claimed that two mainstay institutions on the island — resort and retail — are failing because the codes related to them are dated.

Sanibel has not allowed any code rewrite for the modernization of the resort industry," Adler said. "The retail industry has polarized into two prime shopping centers and the other small shopping centers on the island have been converted to business. The Sanibel Plan does not address dealing with the resort industry or the retail industry.

Adler suggested that the plan be rewritten to allow resorts to redevelop and keep the same number of units.

In regards to all of the issues the city is facing, Councilman Steve Brown, must work to maintain the integrity of the island while dealing with the commercial enterprises and cooperating with Lee County.

'We must maintain a joint effort in resolving the issues facing us," Brown

The Sanibel Planning Commission will continue its discussions on the Evaluation and Appraisal report throughout the coming months. The city of Sanibel plans to submit the final report to the state in 2005.

Landscape Committee looks at spoil islands and toll facility

While the future of the Sanibel drawbridge remains unknown, Lee County continues to move forward with its plans to replace spans B and C of the Causeway.

In addition to replacing the bridges, the county must also redesign and redevelop the two spoil islands leading to Sanibel. To assist the county in these efforts, the Roadway Landscape Advisory sub-committee continues to review the proposed Causeway plans and report back to the county.

At its last meeting, the Landscape Committee reviewed the proposed plans for spoil islands A and B as well as the plans for the new toll facility.

One major change proposed for spoil island A is its location in relation to the new bridge. If constructed, the replacement bridge for span A will be located to the east of the existing bridge and the majority of the island will be to the right of the bridge as it approaches the touchdown area. URS, Lee County's landscape consultants, plans to keep most of the existing vegetation and turf area on the island.

However, palm trees and native orna-

mental grasses will be planted on either side of the touchdown areas. URS has also planned a larger retention pond along the island at the approach to span B.

Another change for spoil island A is an island u-turn. The turn, located just before the approach to Fort Myers, would allow drivers access to spoil island A. At the center of the u-turn, URS, to plant several native palms and grasses on the slope leading to a retention pond.

Spoil island B, the island used the most by visitors, will maintain its current design. However, URS has planned some minor improvements to the access roads on and off the spoil island. Visitors will be able to access the spoil island at specified entrance and exit driveways located on either side of the roadway.

The picnic tables will remain on the island as well as the rest room facility. URS also plans to line the roadway with palm trees and a retention pond.


With a new bridge comes a new toll plaza. When planning the design for the new toll plaza, URS selected a style reminiscent of an old Florida home. URS designed the structure and its surrounding to give the facility a native Florida flare.

"We tried to stay with mainly native species to keep the natural look around the Florida style architecture of the toll plaza," said Dave Crowley, a consultant for URS.

URS plans to plant royal palms along the roadway, both entering and exiting the toll plaza area. A retention pond near the toll plaza will be circled with native palms facing the water. Although the proposed retention pond will eliminate some of the parking near the boat ramp, the county plans to have additional parking spaces. The new parking facility at the boat ramp will have more than 100 spaces for cars and boat trailers.

The Roadway Landscape Advisory sub-committee has not yet set a date for their next meeting. However, its members plan to take the information discussed to the Roadway Landscape Advisory Committee for review.

City to conduct smoke testing of sewer lines

Work crews will conduct a smoke test of the city sanitary sewer system at the lift station located at 1547 Periwinkle Way starting at 9 m. on May 4, 2004.

A "Smoke Test" survey will assist our inspection crews in locating breaks and defects in our sewer system.

The smoke you see coming from the vent stacks on houses or holes in the ground is non-toxic, non-staining, has no odor, is white to gray in color, and creates no fire hazard.

The smoke should not enter your home unless you have defective plumbing or dried up drain traps.

It is advisable for the home owner to pour a gallon of water into each floor drain prior to our testing. If smoke enters your home there is good reason to assume that dangerous sewer gases may also be entering your home or business. You should evacuate immediately and notify our work crews. If you are not home and discover smoke when you return, please call the City of Sanibel at 472-1636.

IMPORTANT: if there is any individual in your home or business who has respiratory problems and is immobile, please notify the City at 472-1008 prior to testing.



Long-time islander, Maurice Oshry, retiring Sanibel Music Festival's PR man par excellence, was awarded the Chamber of Commerce's Islands of the Arts volunteer award for 2003/4. Since he planned to leave for the summer before the Chamber's Annual Meeting, he was presented his award at the Festival's final concert.

"Maurice was a very innovative marketing director who worked tirelessly for the Festival for 18 years," former Festival President Nancy Clark said. "He developed our beautiful brochures and advertising, got us recognition in the papers, both on the island and area-wide - even The New York Times... all Maurice's doing!"


"He is a tireless, persistent and creative marketing and public relations person," said former Festival Artistic Director Mary Jaqua, who worked with him for the entire span of the Festival. "An idea manit just doesn't stop!

"Maurice simply doesn't take 'No' for the final answer. He appeals to people with great charm and aplomb — charisma, if you will — and has a gift for making people comfortable enough to see the value of signing on."

Jaqua who also had served as Festival president, continued, "The connections he makes are legendary — an amazingly productive person.

"He told the board 12 years ago he wanted to take the festival national ...to which we said, 'C'mon, Maurice, how are you going to do that?' Well, it was his resourcefulness that made it possible for the concerts to be broadcast by NPR all over the country. He did it with his phenomenal creativity and the linkages he, personally, established. Maurice sees a possibility and makes it a reality."

A native of Cincinnati and a graduate of the University of Cincinnati, Maurice

served in the Air Force in World War II, then worked for an advertising agency for 25 years where, as he puts it, "I learned the creative end of PR and marketing."

Oshry has had a life-long interest in antiques, particularly Russian icons, as well as art, and English furniture. In the '60s and '70s he was a partner in the hugely successful Wilmar Antiques in Hyde Park, Ohio.

After visiting Sanibel a couple of times, in the early '80s he built a house in Tradewinds, which he eventually sold, and has rented "winter quarters" on the island ever since.

In addition to his fall and winter (and summer, actually) commitment to the Festival for close to 20 years, he has served as a volunteer with the Cincinnati Art Museum, chairing countless special events and receiving numerous commendations. He also volunteers with the Playhouse in the Park and, prior to the Cincinnati Museum, devoted his energies to the Taft Museum. This spring, he was elected to a three-year term on the board of the Cincinnati Chamber Music Society which is celebrating its Diamond Anniversary this coming season.


"They are very fortunate," Jaqua added. "All of his attributes make him a very valued player in any organization."

Refuge to conduct 'controlled burns' at 'Ding' Darling

During the 2004 spring season the J. N. "Ding" Darling National Wildlife Refuge will be setting controlled fires on Sanibel island to help preserve the natural ecology of the area and to reduce the likelihood of catastrophic wildfires.

Fire is a natural part of Florida's ecosystem, historically set by lightning. Because of this history of periodic fires, many of Florida's natural communities are adapted to burning. "Many plants and animals are dependent on and benefit from fire. Without fire in these habitats, native plants and animals have a much harder time surviving," said Refuge Manager Rob Jess.

Fire removes old vegetation, promotes new growth of native vegetation and suppresses exotic plants. In the absence of fire, many plant communities are displaced by dense woody vegetation, which can reduce plant diversity and eliminate foraging opportunities for several of the island's wildlife. Species such as the gopher tortoise, Eastern indigo snakes, and the Sanibel rice rat all depend on a fire maintained ecosystem.

In addition to the natural benefits of fire; purposefully setting and controlling fires can prevent wildland fires. This technique, often called "prescribed fire" or "controlled burning," will reduce the amount of dried vegetation – or fuel. When conducting prescribed fires, managers consider environmental conditions such as temperature, relative humidity, recent rainfall, wind speed and direction, soil moisture, fuel conditions, and the type of burn that can be conducted.

Following a predefined 'prescription' allows fire management officers to determine the desired fire behavior (intensity, flame length, direction of fire spread and smoke). A prescribed fire will not be conducted if the prescription can not be met, i.e. if the proper wind

conditions and relative humidity are not present on the day of the burn, the burn will not be conducted.

The refuge will be conducting prescribed burns this spring to reduce the risk of catastrophic wildfires and maintain and improve our wildlife's habitat. Prescribed fire burn plans have been approved by regional fire experts and authorization will be obtained from the State of Florida immediately prior to conducting burns. The refuge will implement burning as soon as the proper conditions are present. Firefighters from the J. N. "Ding" Darling NWR, Florida Panther National Wildlife Refuge, and other Florida refuges will be conducting the burns.

To the Editor,

"Let us reason together":

The present causeway was built in 1963, to lightweight standards with second-rate materials, as a short-range solution to the ferry problem. It has far outlived its intended life-span. No sort of "gift-wrapping" will solve its inadequate design problem. It must be replaced NOW.

Sanibel's roads are like a "flooded basement" which needs to be drained promptly: From 7 a.m. to 11 a.m. hundreds of service people flow in, one to a vehicle, to take care of Sanibel and Captiva stores, hotels, restaurants, schools, salons and residents.

From 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. hundreds of visitors flow in, to visit Sanibel and Captiva beaches, restaurants, stores, etc.

From 3 p.m. to 6 p.m., this whole eight hours of traffic tries to leave the island in three hours - - but it is choked at the corner of Periwinkle, Lindgren and Causeway Roads, because there is only one lane on the Causeway to "drain the island". All of us have experienced that problem.

So, it is obvious that we need "two lanes off" the island - - and an intersection at Periwinkle, Lindgren and Causeway Roads - which will allow the unbroken flow of traffic off the island, in order to "drain our flooded basement.

The new Causeway will be with us for 40 years, so we must insist that it be properly designed, with "two lanes off" the island. Let's insist on that, before it's too late.

To the Editor.

Save Our Bay, Inc. is truly disappointed to learn the results of Lee County's contracts for construction of Spans B and C of the proposed Sanibel Causeway Project. Apparently the lowest bids for this work may total \$40 million, or more than \$10 million in excess of the \$29,958,000 County estimate. This result set off a predictable and unseemly Lee BOCC scramble to find someone to blame, a scapegoat. We and the City of Sanibel are not that entity.

We believe Lee County has no one but itself to blame for the present predicament. Neither the City of Sanibel lawsuit nor the Save Our Bay law suits involve Spans B and C. in fact, Lee County does not have to sell any bonds to pay for new Span B and C bridges. The past profits earned by the County from Sanibel Causeway tolls far exceed the County's new estimated cost of these two spans. The County, however, chose to spend most of those profits elsewhere in Lee County.

Additionally, Lee County has chosen to default on its promise to maintain the Sanibel Causeway bridges in good operating condition. Also, it has chosen to unilaterally change the proposed Span A bridge from a 26-foot high bascule bridge to a 70foot high fixed span bridge. This change significantly increases the capacity of the Sanibel Causeway to deliver vehicles, passengers and cargo to Sanibel Island. The County blatantly violated the contractual rights of the City of Sanibel and the rights of

Next, Lee County could have greased the skids for its proposed Sanibel Causeway by just following Florida law in its operation of Sanibel Causeway. From at least 1989 through 2003, it collected what amounted to unlawful taxes from Sanibel Causeway users/toll payers. Sanibel Causeway is a self-liquidating project. Florida law does not allow a owner/operator like Lee County to make a \$4 M profit on total annual tolls of

By its own admission, from 1989 through 2003 Lee County collected \$89,223,000 in Sanibel tolls, paid \$20,744,000 in operating and maintenance expenses. Lee County realized \$68,369,000 in profits or net revenues from Sanibel Causeway. Lee County tolls yielding a profit of 76.63%, a profit margin that would make any business owner ecstatic. Sanibel Causeway profits or net revenues realized by Lee County during that 15-year period exceed its estimated cost for the entire new Sanibel Causeway Lee County proposes to build (\$66,735,000).

To this day, Lee County proposes to continue its practice of charging unlawful tolls for Sanibel Causeway far into the future. It even "threatens" to increase tolls. We believe there is NO legally defensible justification for issuing bonds to pay for any part of Lee County's proposed Sanibel Causeway Project. Thus, it appears to Save Our Bay, Inc., that it may be appropriate to add the word "scofflaw" to the description of Lee County's actions with respect to Sanibel Causeway.

On three separate occasions, earlier groups of Sanibel Island residents took Lee County to court over this practice, and they won. For example, in 1977 Lee County's attempt to finance construction of six mainland roads, including one roughly 12 miles from Sanibel Causeway, was struck down by the Florida Supreme Court. The decisions in those lawsuits clearly establish limits on Lee County's ability to use Sanibel Causeway profits for anything other than operating and maintenance of that Causeway and its debt service. Lee County proposes to continue spraying Sanibel Causeway net revenues all over Lee County, instead of limiting them to uses directly and physically linked to Sanibel Causeway. By the way, the 1987 Lee County bond included monies associated with a new Sanibel bridge. The Sanibel bridge was never built, so where did those monies go?

The County thus apparently intends to violate not only Florida statutes but also decisions of the Florida Supreme Court. Its plans include a host of mainland projects located even farther away from Sanibel Causeway than those that were barred by the 1977 decision. Its currently estimated cost of nine of its presently proposed future projects is \$15,109,028. Given the history of Spans B and C, one can only wonder just how far off those estimated costs may turn

It appears to us that Lee County's track record with respect to Sanibel Causeway does not inspire trust or confidence. Rather it makes us wary (and, we think, should give everyone else pause). That is one reason why Save Our Bay, Inc., started its lawsuit over Lee County's present actions. We presume similar thoughts may have gone through the minds of City of Sanibel elected officials when they, after a 91.2% referendum vote by Sanibel voters, chose to sue Lee County to enforce its contractual promises to the City and island residents.

Most disturbing is Lee County's argument that its Interlocal Agreement with the City was not legally enforceable against it. The implications of that defense, if upheld, are dire indeed. Will any court let Lee County off the hook on its Agreement with the City of Sanibel on the grounds that Lee County is legally free to ignore its promises and agreements in an Interlocal Agreement with a Lee County municipality? In our opinion, the implications are truly frightening - no one would thereafter have any reason to accept Lee County's word for anything, for such a result is the polar opposite of the rule of the law that characterizes our society.

Finally, we have come to conclusion that Lee County has consistently shortchanged the City of Sanibel in its reimbursement of the City for its costs, and the damage to Sanibel Island and its residents caused by ever-increasing traffic accessing Sanibel Island over the Sanibel Causeway. It is our belief that the City of Sanibel is legally entitled to be fully reimbursed for all of its actual costs of preparing for, handling and accommodating that traffic, passengers and cargo accessing Sanibel Island via Sanibel Causeway. We strongly urge the City of Sanibel to closely review its books and records, make a detailed list of those costs and damages over the years, and compare those costs with the payments it actually received from Lee County. We think it more likely than not that the City will find that it came out on the short end of the stick.

On top of the costs to the City, of course. are the damages inflicted upon Sanibel Island residents and environment by traffic, passengers and cargo accessing Sanibel Island via Sanibel Causeway. Those damages too are proper charges against the revenues of Sanibel Causeway. Again, we urge the City to identify, itemize and quantify those damages in dollars and cents.

That does not end what we believe is the search for all costs of Sanibel Causeway on Sanibel Island. The 1977 decision of the Florida Supreme Court noted that various City projects may qualify for funding with revenues from or bonds repaid with Sanibel Causeway revenues - beachfront and interior parks, improvements to island traffic facilities and roads, public sanitary facilities and boat ramp - provided certain links between them and users of Sanibel Causeway were established. Unfortunately, so far as we can determine, no efforts were made to qualify any of those projects for such funding. We believe Reserves and endowments for accomplishing those matters should find their way into the final solution for Sanibel Causeway.

In the final analysis, however, Lee County had a good chance to catch the low point in the price of steel in 2002 (\$240 a ton vs. \$422 a ton today) when it signed the Interlocal Agreement with Sanibel. Why did it wait until just a few months ago to proceed to bidding? To us it makes no sense whatsoever. A County Commissioner is quoted saying "There's no engineer willing to put their license on the line that says this rehabilitation needs to be done and it can work." We suggest he pay attention to their own hired expert, Dr. Dr. Abdul-Hamid Zureick, and the website: www.sciencedaily.com/releases/ 1998/10/981021075448.htm.

We urge Lee County to reconsider the fate of Span A. Lee County DOT rejected rehabilitation without completing a full analysis. The fact that it may enable Lee County to save tens of millions of dollars and considerable time may be sufficient reason to reevaluate and change its present decision about the type of Span A bridge it wants for its proposed Sanibel Causeway Project. We hope so.

Library expansion nears completion

The 10,000 square foot addition to the Sanibel Public Library will be completed "by the middle of May or close to it," according to Bob Bower, Project Superintendent for Compass Construction. "We're gonna try."

The building is in its final stages of construction, with roof panels going on by the end of next week. Fortunately, says Mr. Bower, the shell is the primary component of a library building. "It's all open space inside," he says. "We have two walls on the first floor and eight walls on the second, and that's it."

Patricia Allen, Library Director, says the addition will house a Local History room and three new meeting rooms. The library will also move the audiovisual collection to the back to make room for DVDs and books on CD. The magazine collection will move to a quiet area that overlooks the lake.

Mrs. Allen relates that building and expansion of the original library on Tarpon Bay were financed in part by bake sales and sales of special "Sanibel Library" license plates. Fortunately, over time the Library Board saved enough money to pay first for the current building, built in 1994, and then for the expansion as well. "We had no separate bond issue," she says.

Mrs. Allen, who came to Sanibel in 1991, was instrumental in the design of the current library. She and her staff developed a wish list for the library layout, hoping to keep services together and noisy areas separated from

With Sheeley Architects of Fort Myers, she visited other libraries in Lee County to find out what worked and didn't work in their buildings. The result of this research was a Building Program Statement that described her vision and that of her staff.

More room will be a welcome feature of the addition. "We especially wanted to move the books up," gestures Mrs. Allen, "off the bottom shelves, for those among us with bifocals and arthritic knees and hips.

The addition carries forward the services of a library whose patrons actually write appreciative letters to the staff. Not just Sanibel residents, mind you — visitors drop the library staff notes of thanks for making their vacations even better.

Mrs. Allen seems completely serene in the midst of construction and change.

Why isn't she worrying? Panicking?

"Jack Perlowski is the Chairman of the Expansion Committee," she smiles. "I don't have to worry because I

According Bob Bower, the library addition has been delayed by the problems with the Sanibel bridge. "We expected to be done before season actually started," says Mr. Bower. However, new regulations on the bridge have forced the contractors to make multiple lighter-weight trips with materials such as sand mix and dry wall in order to meet truck weight restrictions.

Truck permitting has been an additional obstacle. A truck that is over limit can have its permit pulled on its



second violation, and trucks without permits are banned from Sanibel.

"Contractors only have so many trucks," says Mr. Bower. If the contractor's trucks get banned, and the contractor can't deliver to the site, then a different contractor has to take over.

"We especially wanted to move the books up," gestures Mrs. Allen, "off the bottom shelves, for those among us with bifocals and arthritic knees and hips."

Changes in contractors can mean changes in materials, and changes in materials mean submitting changed construction documents to the City of Sanibel for reapproval.

"We follow the procedure," says Mr. Bower, "but how

do you figure that into the bid process?"

No one could have foreseen the impact of the bridge issues on the library expansion, says Mr. Bower. The groundbreaking ceremony for the new building took place in July 2003, before the scope of the issues with the bridge was fully apparent.

Compass Construction is also doing upgrades to the

existing library building, replacing windows with impact glass. The library is considered a "building of last resort," a shelter for those who absolutely could not evacuate the island during a hurricane. The library and the expansion are built on deep pilings for stability and with every consideration for safety in an emergency

"It's all about Life Safety," says Mr. Bower, "that's

Mr. Bower is a man who clearly takes pride in his projects. He points to the left side of the construction site: We've had a pile of dirt over there since we started building," he says. "It's an eyesore, but we can't afford to take it away and then bring it back when we need it." He

To the layperson, a pile of dirt is something you'd naturally find at a place where someone dug a big hole. But not to Mr. Bower. Clearly a tidy construction site is a happy construction site.

Mr. Bower is full of praise for the City of Sanibel and for the library staff and volunteers. "The City has been a tremendous help," he says, especially in allowing the contractors to use the city parking lot adjacent to the library for storage and equipment. "And the library has been very understanding.

"Plus," he says with a smile, "it's beautiful working in

The library will have an Open House to celebrate the addition next fall.







Some Chamber tips to avoid power outages

Last week [April 12], we experienced power outages on the islands as a result of a storm that brought with it high winds for an extended period. These outages are caused by tree branches that come in contact with power lines.

At the end of this month, Lee County Electric Cooperative (LCEC) will be starting a major tree trimming project on the islands in order to maintain the electric system and keep their equipment operating safely. As part of their commitment to providing safe and reliable electric service to Sanibel and Captiva Islands, they will be trimming trees which are coming in contact with their main 3-phase circuit line that runs from the Causeway all the way to South

This major effort is being done to proactively reduce unsafe conditions (trees conduct electricity and create potential safety hazards when branches contact power lines) and to maintain reliable service (when branches come in contact with the power lines they cause outages or fires).


This major project entails the lines that are within LCEC's area of responsibility. Customers are responsible for maintaining trees and vegetation around secondary lines and outside of the utility easements. These include the service drop lines that lead into your home or place of business.


In order to assist LCEC in their efforts to provide all of us with reliable (and continuous) electric service, the Chamber urges all of our members to examine the area around their power lines and keep the trees trimmed on a regular maintenance cycle.

As the summer storm season approaches, now is the time for everyone to work together to do their part to keep our electric service running. Power outages are especially threatening to the business community (you can not process credit cards and often times the outages are damaging to computer and electronic equipment). There is no need for us to accept power outages as a way of life on the islands. We can, with a little preventive maintenance, improve the quality of life for all of us in our community.

We intend to help support LCEC's efforts to reduce or eliminate power outages by trimming the trees at the Chamber Visitor Center which are in contact with or threaten the power lines. We hope you will do the same at your home and place of business.







Red mangroves don't respond well to pruning

Dear Ron: I have mangroves some (probably red) beginning to grow outside the seawall. Everybody who sees them tells me to get rid of them right away, but I really don't want to.

It's my understanding that I can keep them trimmed Island so they don't block the view and more Gardening importantly, since they attract a lot of Ron Sympson shellfish and calcium deposit around

them, they gradually become a solid mass which actually protects the seawall.

Am I right or does everybody else know something that I don't?

- Jena Duncannon, Matlacha.

Dear Jena: You are absolutely right in suggesting that the sediment that builds up around red mangroves (Rhizophora mangle) eventually becomes a solid mass that is valuable in protecting the shoreline. The red mangrove is an attractive native because of its prop roots and year-round yellow flow-

The major problem I see is that the trees can reach up to 40 feet in height, but since they respond very poorly to pruning, cutting them back to avoid blocking the view may well kill them.

However, in some localities it is unlawful to remove red mangroves. You need to check with local and county authorities about this

Adaptable to Florida hardiness zones 10 and 11, the red mangrove is highly tolerant of both soil and air salt.

Butterflies and plants they like need lots of sun

Dear Ron: Our church butterfly garden is mostly under the dappled shade of slash pine trees, with some full sun as the day progresses. Firespike and ixora are not blooming. We also planted two antique roses there.

Will they have a problem with lack of light?

Dear Mary: Butterflies follow the sun in search of nectar from flowering plants. The vast majority of flowering plants - including the ones you mentioned — require six or more hours a day of full sun for best blooming.

If the plants in your butterfly garden are receiving inadequate sunlight, you will have difficulties getting the plants to bloom, and therefore, attracting butterflies.

Pep up your areca palms with quality fertilizer

Dear Ron: We recently planted dozens of areca palms along our property line, but they are growing slowly. What is the best type of fertilizer for areca palms? And How often should I apply it?


- Ewald Hass, Fort Myers

Dear Ewald: Apply a quality palm fertilizer, such as 9-4-9 or 13-3-13, and make sure it includes as least 4 percent of these secondary elements: magnesium, iron and manganese. For newly planted palms, I'd apply the fertilizer every other month now through October.

You should also apply a thick layer of shredded mulch.

The areca palm (Chrysalidocarpus lutescens) has a moderate growth rate and is also known as butterfly palm, yellow butterfly palm, and golden feather palm. It is native to Madagascar and adaptable to Florida hardiness zones 9-11. It is moderately salt-tolerant.

Take McGregor Blvd. north, left on John Morris Road, left on Iona.

Wisteria does best in north and central Florida

Dear Ron: Will wisteria do OK down here? I love the looks and fragrance. – Linn Benninger, Fort Myers

Dear Linn: Wisteria, valued throughout much of the United States as a vine that produces drooping clusters of pretty, violetblue flowers, can be grown in successfully in Florida hardiness zones 8-9B, but does not do well south of Lake Okeechobee.

Often called Chinese wisteria (Wisteria sinensis) for its native habitat of China, the vine is not salt-tolerant. It is considered a class 2 invasive exotic by the Florida Exotic Pest Plant Council, meaning it has the potential to displace other species of plant

Spots on fan palm fronds may mean fungus

Dear Ron: The fronds on our Chinese fan palms are showing signs of some kind of disease. We would like to know what to do These beautiful palms need help.

Dear Marjorie: Leaf spots on Chinese fan palms are ordinarily the result of a fungus.

If that is the case, you should consult with an expert at a local garden center for an appropriate fungicide.

The palms can also be affected by scales,

aphids and root rot, and they are moderately susceptible to lethal yellowing disease.

The Chinese fan palm (Trachycarpus fortunei) is also known as windmill palm. It is native to China and adaptable to Florida hardiness zones 11. It is moderately salt tol-

Sour oranges are great for making marmalade

Dear Ron: I have a tree with fruit that looks like oranges. I was told that they are sour oranges. What are they used for.? Do you use them for cooking? How do I take care of this tree? It is full-grown and produces lots of fruit.


Dear Virginia: The primary value of the sour orange (Citrus aurantium) is for its disease-resistant rootstock, on to which many other varieties of citrus are often grafted. It produces small, round, bright-orange fruit with a thick, bitter peel and very sour juice. The tree can reach a height of 30 feet and is known for its many thorns. Care for the sour orange like you would any other citrus

The species is native to Southeastern Asia and found its way to Europe in the 11th century; some still-living trees in Spain are believed to be over 600 years old. It was introduced to Florida in the 1700s by conquering Spaniards.

Though the fruit is too sour to be eaten out of hand or for juicing, it is said to be the absolute best kind of citrus for making marmalade. The juice is also good for flavoring fish and meat, and oil from the peel is used for making the popular Curacao liqueur.


Nationwide sales of the existing inventory of homes are exceptionally high. In real estate history records, there have only been eight other months in which the national rate of home sales reached or exceeded the six million mark, as it did in February 2004, when existing home sales were recorded at a seasonally adjusted annual rate of 6.12 million units.

Economists are saying that the housing market could defy expectations this year. The chief economist for the National Association of Bealtors projects that home sales are going to decline slightly, but that home buying and selling continues for now at exceptionally high levels. This is due largely to historically low mortgage interest rates that are enabling millions to obtain affordable mortgage loans.

If interest rates persist in this low holding pattern, home sales will probably sustain these second levels, at least until the accord half of 2004 when rates are consistent as in the sales.

second half of 2004, when rates are expected to rise. The fact that the demand for housing from a growing population is greater than the current supply of homes should keep prices competitive and sales dynamic, even if mortgage rates increase.





Edie Mugridge, shell expert and Sanibel pioneer, dies at 98

Edith H. Mugridge, long-time resident, a renowned shell expert and Sanibel businesswoman, passed away on Thursday, April 8, 2004, at Hospice House of natural causes. She had turned 98 on March 26.

Mugridge graduated from Boston University's Sargent College of Allied Sciences in 1938. She served on the faculty of Lesley Normal School in Boston, where she taught kindergarten games and folk dancing and served as Director of Health Education at the Cambridge YWCA. Then she was off to Duluth, Minn., initially working in health and physical education but ending up teaching industrial arts. "I taught woodworking, but had never had a day's training for it." She earned her M.Ed. at Wayne State and completed all the course work for her Ed.D. at the University of Mexico.

She first learned about Sanibel from the pages of a 1949 National Geographic and was never shy about admitting what really brought her to Sanibel so many years ago... warm waters, water-skiing and fishing.

Not to say the island had made the best of first impressions. It was a rainy Fourth of July in 1950 when she first crossed over on the 11 a.m. ferry from Punta Rassa, and the mosquitoes were so anxious to greet her that they came through the vents in her car. She drove up to Blind Pass and back, cutting over on Rabbit Road in search of a place to stay. But everything was shut down for the summer, so, out of luck, she left on the 11:30 ferry.

She was better prepared the next summer when she came for a two-week stay with her boat and a good friend. They ended up staying the entire summer at Hyers Cottages for \$99, water-skiing up to Bailey's store (then located next to the ferry landing) every morning. They'd also often fish for snook at 4 a.m., catch three or four keepers, then head over to Timmy's Nook for a beer at 7. "We'd been working hard since very early," Edie said with a sly smile in a 1995 interview.

In a later interview, she vividly recalled how much fun it was to be invited to the 1951 Fourth of July party at the Lighthouse. That's when Mugridge met Uncle Clarence, the Baileys, the Naves, the Billheimers, the "girls" from the Nutmeg House and lots of other people. Uncle Clarence made the hush puppies, since he had two bottles of beer, he added one to the hush puppies to make them even better. Alan Nave cooked the mullet. Hap Payne cooked too, and everybody brought something to

"I knew nothing about shells [when I first got here]." she said. The closest she had come to shelling at that time was digging clams and oysters for food with her father on the beaches near her hometown of Cambridge, Mass. But, on the island, she fished morning, noon and night, and that's what created her interest in shells. There were so many shells on the beach but she had never thought much about them. She came from New England where they dug clams and oysters, but the shells down here were much more beautiful and interesting.

But she started collecting shells that summer. She couldn't help but notice them, she recalled, "there were just so many of them, and they were so beautiful! The shells were knee-deep in the '50s." She knew from her first visit in 1951 that Sanibel eventually would be her

Mugridge bought eight acres of land on the Gulf in 1955 — bought the property on a five-year note and. when it was paid, came down to stay, even though she later determined that it would be too expensive to develop. That was in 1961.

At the time there was only one telephone on the island, and no calls came in. It was just used to call out. And, when you did, you needed someone to spray and or swish the mosquitoes while you were calling. The island was beautiful with all dirt roads, all sand and nothing like the present Gulf Drive. The fishing was fantastic - Mugridge said she would invariably catch more than she could eat and would always bring some to Grandfather Gavin, getting to know all of his 20 children in the process.

But, getting bored with nothing to do except fish, she rented a building from Churchhill and Hayes Hudson on the Gulf next to the Nutmeg House (now the Riviera) where she taught shell craft and sold shells and gifts. A shell table created by Edie in that first shop served as the prize in the very first Sanibel Shell Fair Raffle.

Mugridge helped build the island's first firehouse (now the Bait Box) on Periwinkle Way as a charter member of the fire department. The only female volunteer, Edith recalls going to plenty of fires, although her main duties were to help supply the men with extra water tanks (which they carried like backpacks — there were no fire engines back then) and cool drinks made of lime juice.

In 1962, Mugridge purchased and refurbished Helen Denning's shop at 2341 Periwinkle Way, later expanding it to include living quarters in back and a separate guest house. She named the shell shop after what then was considered the rarest shell in the world, Glory of the Sea.

The store was not without its namesake. About a year after opening the shop, noted malacologist, Dr. R. Tucker whom she had met and befriended during an island picnic — told her of a Glory of the Sea that had been sold to the president of the Bank of Australia by a native of the Admiralty Islands. Edith purchased the shell, which she believed was the first of its kind to be privately owned. She proudly displayed it in a case, where it slowly rotated for the remaining 32 years she ran

Edith made several trips a year to various destinations throughout the world, visiting more than 40 different islands in the Pacific, Caribbean and Central and South America and often traveling with a small group of malacologists (they study shells, while conchologists study the creatures who inhabit the shells). In keeping with her active lifestyle, she learned to scuba dive when she was almost 70.

Prior to a trip to American Samoa, Dr. Abbott wrote a letter of introduction for Edith to the "talking chiefs" of one of the villages he had visited more than 50 years earlier. In that letter he informed the chiefs that on Sanibel Edith "holds the respect and rank of a princess and should be given suitable hospitality.

Edith had foreseen a far different future in her youth when she aspired to be a doctor. She credits the first-aid she learned and administered as a Girl Scout for kindling that interest. She was only the third girl in America to achieve the rank of Golden Eaglet and she also received the Medal of Merit from President Woodrow Wilson for selling the most World War I bonds among the Massachusetts Girls Scouts. A gunpowder accident at age 8 left her blind in her left eye, deaf in her left ear and missing several fingers on her left hand, all of which prevented her from entering the medical field.

Failing sight in her remaining eye forced her to give up her shell shop in 1992. Mugridge gave her thousands of shells to the Museum, the Community Association, the Fort Myers Shell Club and the Sanibel Shell Club.

But it was only a matter of months before Glory of the Sea was reincarnated as the preview center for the soonto-be Bailey-Matthews Shell Museum, courtesy of Edie, who continued to reside in the back portion of the building. Before the Museum proper opened, her guest house served as a workshop for making the school kits the museum sends out as and as a processing center for hundreds of cases of books the museum received from around the world.

Edie's oft-stated dream was that the Shell Museum's library be of such quality that it would not only promote

an active interest in shells among youngsters but also provide historical as well as up-to-date information to amateur and professional shell collectors and students of malacology. This dream, which Edie's friends and associates shared wholeheartedly, led to the establishment of the Edith H. Mugridge Library Fund in recognition of her incalculable contributions to this one-of-a-kind museum.

In 1999, a new species of the Conoidea Terebridae

family, Terebre Bruguière genus, was named after Edie Terebra mugridgeae — by renowned conchologist Emilio Garcia, who considered Edie his mentor and who has served as one of the scientific judges for the Shell Show. Although it is common in the Gulf of Mexico off Mississippi in anaerobic sediment (black mud), it had apparently been overlooked because of its small size and inconspicuous coloring. Different from other Terebra species in the western Atlantic region because of its

multi-spiral protoconch of four whorls, it appears to be

found only off the northern coast of the gulf despite similar sedimentary deposits existing in the Gulf as far west as Galveston.

Until the day she died, Edie believed that to have friends you must be a friend. Her goal was always to be the best person that she could possibly be. "I get discouraged," she said, not too long before her death, "because I've been so active all my life — to be so confined is pretty hard to take." But she was always aware of how important her her many, many friends were. "I couldn't be here without them," she said

She leaves behind her nieces and nephews — Diane (Dee) Coughlin, Dale and Susan Crumb, Donald and Cathy Crumb and Deverie Bodgett; an extended list of almost 30 grand- and great-grand-nieces and nephews; many dear friends; and her beloved poodle, Punkin. She was predeceased by her sister, Gladys, and Gladys's husband, Dr. Harold Crumb.

Dave Torrance and Kim Greten opened The Stock Exchange in 2002 to pursue their goal of running a consignment operation that specialized only in high-end, upscale, merchandise.

The model for their store came from a store founded by Dave's mother, Connie, who opened the original Stock Exchange in Barrington, Rhode Island, in 1975.

When they were planning their enterprise, Dave and Kim looked

closely at the local market and decided to concentrate on just furniture, home furnishings, and art. "We don't accept bedroom furniture, lanai furniture, or clothing," says Dave.

Inventory at the store runs the gamut from quirky, hand-painted chairs and tables to serious Victorian antiques to formal upholstered pieces. Lamps, florals, rugs, throws, and wall art also decorate the 4000-square-foot showroom.

"Kim deserves all the credit" for the appearance of the store, says Dave. She is responsible for the arrangement and layout, and for the small touches that make the store so beautiful. Kim also runs an interior design service called Designing Woman.

In general, Dave and Kim find that their serious shoppers are people building a "new second home," who are looking for contemporary, colorful pieces.


The response, according to Dave, "has been phenomenal." The store has over 500 consignors, and receives calls daily from individuals and companies who hope to place pieces with them

If the consignor brings the piece to the store, the split is 50/50. If the store picks up the piece, the split is 40/60. Each consignor is guaranteed a price for each item, with a sliding scale of pricing over time.

"We don't bargain," says Dave. "When you consign with us, you are guaranteed a specific dollar amount" when the piece sells. "You know exactly what you'll be reimbursed at any given point in time."


